

## CONSTITUTION REVIEW EXERCISE OF THE REPUBLIC OF GHANA

The Constitution Review Commission (CRC) of the Republic of Ghana was established by His Excellency the President of the Republic of Ghana on 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2010. The mandate of the Commission as set in the Constitution Review Commission of Enquiry Instrument, 2010 (C.I. 64), is to:

1. Ascertain from the people of Ghana, their views on the operations of the 1992 **Fourth Republic Constitution** and , in particular, the strengths and weakness of the Constitution:
2. Articulate the concerns of the people of Ghana as regards the amendments that may be required for a comprehensive review of the 1992 Constitution; and
3. Make recommendations to the Government for consideration and provide a draft Bill for possible amendments to the 1992 Constitution.

The Commission which is an independent body intends to conduct a thorough research and open and transparent consultative processes aimed at eliciting views from Ghanaians both home and abroad on the operation and possible amendment of the 1992 Constitution.

In this regard, the Commission wishes to bring to the attention of Ghanaians resident abroad some of the issues so far submitted. The Commission is confident that the input of Ghanaians in the Diaspora will definitely help in enriching the formulation of a sound constitution which reflects the collective ethos of Ghanaians.
